Context

Research shows that effective knowledge transfer is difficult. This project aims to bridge the gap between research and practice through a network of knowledge brokers*.

Project Knowledge Brokers PERRIN

- ➤ 4 Rehabilitation centers in the Netherlands
- > 2 Knowledge brokers per rehabilitation center
- ➤ 1 Network of knowledge brokers

- * A **Knowledge Broker** (KB) is an opinion leader within an organization, who connects researchers and practitioners. He adapts research findings to make them suitable for use by practitioners.
- > 1 Mission: to implement 6 measures in pediatric rehabilitation
- > 8 knowledge brokers reached over 200 professionals of different teams

How did we collaborate?

- A 'Broker to the Brokers' (BtB) organized and coordinated the KB-network.
- The knowledge brokers made a tailored implementation plan for their own centre.
- The knowledge brokers exchanged knowledge, experiences and products, e.g. through meetings and a limited-access web forum.
- The knowledge brokers were in direct contact with each other, with their fellow care providers and collaborated closely with researchers.

What has been changed?

- > Evaluation by questionnaires showed significantly more familiarity and use of measures.
- Communicating findings with patients as an important step in implementation of measures could be improved.
- Through collaboration, centers benefit from each other and save time.
- The KB-network forms a steady bridge between research and practice.
- ▶In the Netherlands the KB-network has now been expanded from 4 to 20 centers.
